

Year 12 Visit to Christ Church College, University of Oxford

On Wednesday 12 February, our Year 12 studenrs visited Christ Church College of the University of Oxford as part of the Outreach Programme. The students were treated to an insightful day in Oxford planned by the Admissions and Access Manager of Christ Church College, Dr Ana Hastoy. Dr Hastoy 'demystified' the application process to get

into Oxford University and offered opportunities to our students to engage with questions and answers. Victoria, our school alumna, who is studying in Oxford, paid a visit to us as part of the student panel and was particularly keen to share her personal experiences from her time in the university and the college.

Later on, the students were invited to enjoy a delightful lunch served in the imposing Tudor dining hall, surrounded by the portraits of King Henry VIII, Cardinal Wolsey and other notable alumni of the college. This year Christ Church College celebrates its 500th anniversary and our students were appreciative of the tour of the college and the visit to its impressive library as they admired rare manuscripts and early printed books. The trip culminated with the visit to the Weston Library, integral part of the Bodleian Libraries, were the students marvelled at the exhibitions on 'Oracle, Omens and Answers' and 'Listen in: How Radio Changed the Home'.


Below are the reflective comments of some of our students:

This workshop gave us direct insight into what top universities value beyond just our A Level results. We spoke to students in a Q&A panel, which gave us the opportunity to ask any questions we had regarding university life. Also, we visited several libraries in Oxford and looked at their exhibitions, which was both educational and edifying. Katerina

Dr Ana Hastoy clearly explained to us the admissions process for Oxford and what Oxford offers to potential candidates; enthusiasm for the subject, academic ability, and most importantly an array of courses that are intellectually stimulating. She also taught us the best ways to enrich our personal statements through super-curricular activities, and how they could involve anything from reading to listening to podcasts, as it is more important to say what you learnt and what you thought about them. We also had a Q&A session with three Oxford students, including Victoria, a previous STA student, in her third year of maths, who shared her experience at Oxford, truly inspiring for us, fellow students. 

Sparx Reader is an online reading platform allowing students to regularly read books for pleasure. Everyday reading is not only a relaxing activity, but also allows students to expand their ideas, vocabulary and improve understanding of any text they will face in exams or as adults.

Sparx Reader offers students a choice of books at their reading level, as well as ensuring they read books with understanding by completing check-in questions along the way. The platform is used for KS3 English weekly homework; students need to achieve minimum 300 points each week (this equates to approximately 30 min of careful reading).

We are very pleased that many of our students exceed this target every week, with some top scorers achieving well above a thousand points a week. Since the launch of Sparx Reader a month ago, our KS3 students have completed amazing 3394 hours of careful reading and read altogether 1 books so far. Truly well done!

Winter Pressures – Helping You Get The Care You Need

A&Es across Barnet and our neighbouring boroughs are under significant pressure, with a high number of flu cases, particularly among children and young people. Please follow this advice to all parents and carers on keeping yourself and your children well.

- Flu cases are currently very high in Barnet. If you think you or your child may have flu, find out what steps to take: <u>flu symptoms in</u> <u>children</u> and young people and <u>flu advice for adults</u>
- It's not too late to get vaccinated. If you are <u>eligible for a flu jab</u>, contact your GP or <u>book an appointment at your local community</u> <u>pharmacy</u>. Has your child missed their flu vaccination at school? <u>Find catch-up clinics in Barnet</u>.
- Your GP practice is here to help. We have made additional evening and weekend GP appointments available throughout winter for adults and children across Barnet. <u>Find out how to book</u>
- Your local pharmacist can provide expert advice and medicines for minor health conditions and you don't need an appointment. Find out
 about the services pharmacies offer: <u>Think Pharmacy First</u>
- NHS urgent treatment centres or walk-in centres can help with urgent, but non-life threatening, injuries or illnesses.
- This might be sprains and strains, suspected broken bones, injuries, cuts and bruises, stomach pain, vomiting and diarrhoea, skin infections and rashes, or high temperatures. Find details of local centres

Young people under the age of 16 can give or refuse consent themselves if considered competent to do so by nursing staff.

If your child has had this immunisation elsewhere <u>after</u> you have submitted the consent form, you MUST inform Vaccination UK, or your child's school.
