Saint Nicholas

During the Advent period, a great saint of the Church is celebrated. Saint Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors, and he is commemorated on 6 December.



Presents are given on this day. As Saint Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors, boats are decorated as in the image above.

Saint Nicholas is also the patron saint of Greece, and the patron saint for students, merchants and children.

Gifts in shoes or socks

One tradition on the eve of Saint Nicholas' feast day is for children to leave their shoes outside the front door of their house for Saint Nicholas. In the morning, they should find small gifts, such as sweets, fruit, toys, and a few coins. This symbolizes the great charitable works of the saint. Other gifts one can leave in children's shoes are:

- gold coins representing the money he threw into the window of a poor family's house
- a toy representing the toys he had commissioned a toymaker to make for poor children
- something that represents the saint's devotion to God: a spiritually oriented book, an icon, cross or prayer rope.
- something to represent the food he would give to the poor (fruit, nuts etc).
- an item of clothing representing him clothing the poor.
- a toy ship symbolizing the many sailors saved through his prayers.

Another tradition is to do a charitable work or make a donation, as this is what Saint Nicholas always did. Saint Nicholas models obedience to Christ by feeding the hungry, helping strangers, and caring for prisoners (Matthew 25:34-36).

Faith - πίστη

The Nativity of Our Lord God and Saviour Jesus Christ (December 25)

In the earliest days of Christianity, the Feast of the Nativity of Christ was not generally celebrated in the Church. The Feast was not celebrated in Jerusalem until the 6th Century. In Rome the Feast of the Nativity of Christ had been celebrated on 25 December since 354.

This date was ultimately chosen by the Church as the date of the Nativity in order to Christianise the pagan Feast of Natalis Invicti or Invincible Sun, which was celebrated on that day. St Cyprian of Carthage noted that this anniversary of the

invincible was made actual only in the birth of Jesus, the only invincible One.



The Christmas story is well-known from the witness accounts of the Holy Scripture:

Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, the Wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, Where is He who has been born king of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him.

When Herod the King heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

They told him, In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it is written by the prophet: 'And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will govern My people Israel.

Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star appeared; and he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, Go and search diligently for the Child, and when you have found Him bring me word, that I too may come and worship Him.

When they had heard the King, they went on their way; and lo, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, until it came to rest over the place where the Child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy; and going into the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother. They fell down and worshipped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way (Matthew 2:1-12).

Now when [the Wise men and shepherds] had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, Rise, take the Child and His mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there till I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy Him. And Joseph rose and took the Child and His mother by night and departed to Egypt. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, Out of Egypt have I called My son.

Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the Wise men, was in a furious rage, and he sent and killed all the male children who were age two or under in Bethlehem.

Prophet Jeremiah said: A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they were no more (Matthew 2:13-18).

Today the Virgin gives birth to the Transcendent One Angels, with shepherds, glorify Him! The wise men journey with the star! Since for our sake, The eternal God was born as a little child! Amen

Upcoming Christmas Events





time because of а family emergency. I will look at each application and make a decision on a case-by-case basis.







Reminder COVID safety



Students should be testing themselves at home twice weekly (Wednesdays and Sundays) using lateral flow tests and results should be reported to the school using our online reporting system.

Please note: Students experiencing any symptoms of COVID must not come into school and must go immediately for a PCR test.

Face coverings: Face coverings should be worn in communal areas in all settings by staff, visitors and pupils or students in year 7 and above, unless they are exempt. Pupils or students (in year 7 or above) should continue to wear face coverings on public and dedicated school transport, unless they are exempt.

Testing: All educational and childcare settings should continue to encourage staff and students to test twice weekly using lateral flow device (LFD) tests.

Contact tracing and isolation: The current guidance on contact tracing and isolation remains in place. In addition to these, any suspected or confirmed close contacts of the Omicron variant will be asked to isolate for 10 days regardless of vaccination status or age. You will be contacted directly and told to isolate.

Vaccination: All eligible staff and students aged 12 and over are encouraged to take up the offer of the vaccine, including boosters. Vaccines are our best defence against COVID-19. They help protect young people and adults, and benefit those around them. Vaccination makes people less likely to catch the virus and less likely to pass it on.

ALL PARENTS AND CARERS MUST READ THIS IF TRAVELLING ABROAD FOR THE CHRISTMAS BREAK

Travel restriction update: Changes to pre-departure testing from 4am, Tuesday 7 December 2021

From 4am, Tuesday 7 December all people aged 12 years and over must take a PCR or LFD COVID-19 test before they travel to England from abroad.

You must take the test within the 2 days before you travel to England.

This will apply whether you qualify as fully vaccinated or

Some people, including children aged 11 and under are exempt from taking the test.

Red list countries and territories

There are different rules if you have been in a red list country or territory in the 10 days before you arrive in England. If you need to follow red list rules, you must do so if you are fully vaccinated or not.


