Dear Parents and Carers,

Lent- A time of preparation for receiving Our Great Lord and Saviour

At around this time, every year Christians around the world embark on a spiritual journey called "Lent" or as Greek Orthodox (and Orthodox people globally) call it, Great Lent. In Greek it's called 'Megali Sarakosti' literally Great Forty Days. This Year, Great Lent in the Eastern Orthodox Church begins on Monday 7 March and ends on Easter Sunday 22 April.

Saracosti, which is the great period of Lent before Orthodox Easter, comes from the word forty, which is the forty day period until Palm Sunday and then one more week until Easter Sunday makes a total of 49 days of "fasting". During this period, we fast so that our bodies and spirits are "cleansed" to prepare for acceptance of the Resurrection.

What is Great Lent? Great Lent is the Greek Orthodox Lent, a time during which we abstain from all animal and dairy

products (such as meats, poultry, game, milk, cheese, eggs, etc.) as well as fish and seafood with backbones.

The main purpose of fasting during Great Lent is to cleanse the body as well as the spirit in preparation for the Resurrection of Christ at Easter, which is the most sacred of all observances in the Greek/Eastern Orthodox faith and the church calendar year. Essentially, the faithful are called upon to adopt a vegan diet for forty days. This may seem modern, but Orthodox Christians follow a long-held tradition among people around the world for thousands of years.

Clean Monday

Clean Monday (Greek: Καθαρά Δευτέρα), also known as Pure Monday, Ash Monday, Monday of Lent or Green Monday, is the first day of the Eastern Orthodox Great Lent. It is a movable feast that occurs at the beginning of the seventh week before Orthodox Easter Sunday. This year it falls on Monday 7 March. Clean Monday refers to the leaving behind of sinful attitudes and non-fasting foods. It is sometimes called Ash Monday, by analogy with Ash Wednesday (the day when the Western Churches begin Lent).

Liturgically, Clean Monday – and thus Lent itself – begins on the preceding Sunday night at a special service called Forgiveness Vespers, which culminates with the Ceremony of Mutual Forgiveness, at which all present will bow down before one another and ask for forgiveness. In this way, the faithful begin Lent with a clean conscience, with forgiveness, and with renewed Christian love. The entire first week of Lent is often referred to as Clean Week, and it is customary to go to confession during this week and to clean the house thoroughly.

Today also brings preceding Apokries (Meat-free Carnival) celebrations to an end, inviting everyone to leave behind the 'sinful' attitudes associated with Carnival festivities and nonfasting foods, which were largely consumed during the last three weeks of the Carnival. It is a national holiday across Greece and Cyprus and special events such as kite flying, and other activities take place in all towns and villages. There is usually music, dancing and delicious vegetarian food, marking the start of this special Greek Orthodox period of fasting and contemplation.

AS stated earlier, during Saracosti, or Great Lent, no meat or dairy food are eaten. Lenten food, usually consists of

plenty of olives, Taramasalata, Tahini, Humous, Halva, vegetables, legumes and seafood, such as calamari, octopus, shrimps, oysters, cuttlefish, mussels, lobsters etc. Fish is not allowed except on two occasions: on the 25 March (Annunciation of the Virgin Mary) and Palm Sunday.

Kathara Deftera (Καθαρά Δευτέρα) is a day where families and friends celebrate with delicious fasting foods, as well as the widespread custom of flying kites.

We wish all of our students and their families a happy Sarakosti!



Application for music lessons Summer 2022

We give students the opportunity to apply and receive music lessons on any instrument of their choice. We will be able to offer tuition in: Piano, Singing, Drums, Guitar (Electric or acoustic), Violin, Flute, Saxophone and Clarinet.

Please note that if your child does not already possess their own instrument, they will need to hire one from Barnet Education Arts Trust, 020 8959 4111 or another provider of your choice.

Lessons are once a week for 20 minutes and they take place during school hours, including some break and lunch times. Students will need to be prepared to miss part of their lesson or break to attend. If there is a valid educational need a student may have their time changed to accommodate but in some cases this may not possible. All lessons will be taught to students individually. To avoid any confusion all the lessons will take place on the same day and time every week. It is the student's responsibility to remember where and when the lessons are taking place and be there on time.

The termly charge is £146 for individual lessons. There are 10 lessons each term. Booking and payments can only be made via the BEAT website, by clicking on this link. Deadline for online bookings is Thursday 10th March 2022.

If your child receives financial assistance at the school, an application can be made via BEAT for assistance with payment for the Summer Term. Please contact BEAT's office for further details and further help: admin@beatrust.org.uk, 0208 959 4111.

Important points to note

- · Once the lessons have been booked refunds cannot be made.
- · In the event that BEAT are unable to deliver in person lessons due to COVID-19 restrictions that may be implemented locally or nationally, lessons will be delivered via Zoom and no refund will be made.

Students who learn instruments will have the opportunity to participate in musical activities such as the school orchestra and ensembles when they reach an appropriate standard. The school choir will be open to beginners.

If more students wish to learn an instrument than places available, priority will be given to those who have previously had lessons on the instrument and it may be possible to arrange more places next term. If there are insufficient number of students wishing to learn an instrument a full refund will be given.
